### REGULAR MEETING - 7:00 P.M.

- 1. Mayor Byrum-Bratsen called the meeting to order at 7:29.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance and Texas Pledge were recited.

#### 3. PUBLIC HEARING

Mayor Byrum-Bratsen opened the public hearing at 7:30 p.m.

Hold a public hearing on the annexation A 34 acre tract and a 26 acre tract, each located in the H.T. & B. R.R. Co. Survey, Section 49, Abstract 259, in Brazoria County, Texas; adjoining the west side of Iowa Colony Boulevard (County Road

65); approximately 2200 feet north of Dubuque Parkway (County Road 63); and approximately 2100 feet south of Davenport Parkway (County Road 64).

  they will break ground soon for the overpass.
